Fredonia Gate

It was decided to go see what the interlocking gate at Fredonia looked like and what needed to be done to get it. This gate was located at the intersection of the Santa Fe line and the Frisco line in Fredonia, KS. This was a standard Frisco manual swing type of gate like the one that was donated from Cherokee. The Cherokee gate was located south of Cherokee, KS where the Missouri Pacific and Frisco crossed. The Cherokee gate was heavily damaged when the BNSF removed it. The hope was to acquire the Fredonia gate in a much better condition for display.

Depot Repair

The repairs on the Boston and Carona depots have been put on hold until the weather warms up. The shingles on the Boston Depot that had been blown off have all been replaced. The south part of the ridge cap has also been repaired. All of the holes caused by woodpeckers have been patched with metal, with one hole in the peak of the gable remaining to be repaired. Russ Green, currently the individual working on the repairs, will have his scaffolding out here at that time. Once that repair is completed, the pressure washing, scraping of loose paint and the painting of the depots will take place.

Propane Leak

The mystery of what happened to our propane has been solved. After replacing our old air compressor we were able to pressure up the line. A leak was discovered at the joint where the pipe comes up to the furnace located on the north side of the new addition. B&B Excavation out of Girard came out on Monday, February 12, and dug up the line and replaced a corroded fitting. The fitting was only 3 years old. In the future, we will try to find better quality materials for projects such as these.

Air Compressor

The old air compressor used for various things at the museum has been replaced with a new one. The old one, which had been donated years ago, developed a leak in a weld on the tank and could not be repaired cost effectively. A new compressor was bought at Harbor Freight in Joplin. The new unit has a one year guarantee. There was a question about the quality of Harbor Freight's products, but it was decided to purchase the compressor from Joplin. With the ease of going to Joplin for a replacement outweighing the hassle of messing with return shipping.

February 14, 2018 - Heart of the Heartlands - Minutes

2018 Train Rides:

The ride list request is being completed. Jim McKeel informed Heart of the Heartlands that he has again spoken with the Hutchinson Director of Downtown Development and he said that he would not assist us in putting on the rides because he can see no benefit to the city. Jim McKeel has arranged to have two, three hour train rides out of Winfield on April 28th. The first ride departing at 9:00 am and arriving back at 11:59 am with the second ride departing at 2:00 pm and returning at 5:00 pm. Jim has also managed to arrange one ride out of Wichita on the following weekend, May 5th. The train will depart Wichita at 8:30 am and arrive at Yoder at 11:00 am. The train will depart Yoder at 2:00 pm and arrive at Wichita at 4:30 pm. John Chambers reported that Jay Hastings has arranged to have three train rides out of Bartlesville on April 14th. The first train will depart at 10:00 am and return at 11:00 am. The other two trains will depart at 1:00 pm and 3:00 pm with both returning an hour after their departure. The Balkan Days rides are in question as the number of persons riding the trains has declined considerably after many years of having train rides. It has been proposed that we may want to cancel the rides for a year or two. Chanute Artist Alley Rides will be on September 29th with the usual 10:00 am, 1:00 pm and 3:00 pm departure times. Dewey, OK has requested three one hour rides on Saturday, September 22nd. Watco's Christmas Ride for the kids will be held sometime in December. Fredonia, KS is also desiring a ride in December as well. There was also discussion for a ride out of Columbus, KS on June 23rd. There would be one ride on this date with a 10:00 am departure time. The ride will be in conjunction with the Columbus Sesquicentennial Celebration.

Safety Meeting:

A meeting will be held at Carona on Saturday, March 10th at 1:00 pm. Jim McKeel will hold a meeting in Wichita on March 11 at 3:00 pm in the back dining room of Panera Bread located at 3337 East Central Avenue, # 101, Wichita, KS, 67208. KCS Motor Car:

Joe Murphey informed the group that until the weather warmed up there was not much to report on the car other than some tinkering.

Depot Repair: The repairs on the Boston and Carona depot have pretty well been put on hold until warmer weather. The blown off shingles on the roof of the Boston Depot have all been replaced as well as the south part of the ridge cap. The woodpecker holes have been patched with metal. One hole in the peak of the gables at each end will be the last one repaired. Russ Green will have his scaffolding out here at that time. The pressure washing, scraping of loose paint and painting will be done in the spring.

Motor Car Rides: John Chambers reported that he has been working with Jay Hastings on some spring motor car rides. There will be an announcement of rides once plans are completed.

New Business

Propane Leak: The mystery of what happened to our propane has been solved. After replacing our old air compressor we had air to pressure up the line. A leak was discovered at the joint where the pipe comes up to the furnace located on the north side of the new addition. B&B Excavation out of Girard came out on Monday, February 12 and dug up the line and replaced a corroded fitting, it was only three years old. We won't buy anymore pipes or fittings from China. These were bought from Home Depot.

Air Compressor: The old air compressor has been replaced with a new one. The old one, which had been donated several years ago, developed a leak in a weld on the tank and could not be repaired cost effectively. A new compressor was bought at Harbor Freight in Joplin. The unit has a one year guarantee. Harbor Freight was questioned about their quality of products but it was decided to go with Harbor Freight as it is much easier to go to Joplin and get another one without all of the hassles of return shipping.

Amtrak Ride: Time is running out!! A train ride and overnight stay to Reno, Nevada and return is planned for a departure of April 21st and returning on April 26th. Six members have already made their train and room reservations. Anyone interested is welcome to come along. Four members will leave from Osceola, Iowa on the Zephyr and three from Kansas City, MO on the Chief where they will make connections with the Zephyr at Galesburg, IL.
