



Museum QR Code Project

An ongoing project this year has been the creation of QR code's for the exhibits that people can see when we are not open. Visitors with a smartphone and a data connection can scan the codes to find out about the item they are currently viewing. Each exhibit has two codes, one with a description that can be read by the person scanning with their phone, and the other a recording of the description being read by our Heartland's member, Bob Capps. 
on the SEK #1000, the Watco caboose, and the Carona Depot. If you have a smartphone or tablet, you can scan the codes on the left to see or hear the description.

November 14, 2020 - Heart of the Heartlands - Minutes

The November 14, 2020 meeting of the Heart of the Heartlands, the annual meeting of the Heart of the Heartlands, was brought to order by President Larry Spahn at 1:00 p.m.

<u>Minutes of previous meeting</u>: Jim McKeel moved to accept the minutes as mailed. Jack Evans seconded the motion, the motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: After the presentation of the treasurer's report by treasurer Brian Carlson, Alan Chilton moved, Jack Evans seconded a motion to accept the treasurer's report. The motion was passed by the membership in attendance.

Old Business:

<u>Visitors</u>: Visitation to the museum has been reduced considerably by the recent resurgence of the Covid-19 virus in our area but visitors do occasionally stop by to visit our outdoor displays.

Tall Grass: The Tall Grass business car has returned to Carona after maintenance at the Coffeyville repair facilities and is parked at the north end of our display track. It is currently parked behind the CVR 70 ton locomotive that will be placed on display sometime in the future.

Display Track: The Watco track crew has moved the display track which they had recently built onto the display pad at the northeast side of the museum. The extremely wet weather in the spring prevented access to the display pad for the construction of the track. The ground finally dried sufficiently to allow heavy machinery to place the track on the pad. Everything is now in place for the CVR engine to be moved. This will entail the use of a heavy crane to lift the engine and also an engine and train crew to move the engine to the main line where it can be accessed by the crane. A lot of things have to occur at just the right time to make this happen but we are one step closer.
