

February 11, 2023 - Heart of the Heartlands - Minutes

The February 11, 2023 meeting of the Heart of the Heartlands was brought to order by President Larry Spahn at 1:00 p.m.

<u>Minutes of previous meeting</u>: John Chambers moved to accept the minutes as mailed. Darrell Cave seconded the motion, the motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: After the presentation of the treasurer's report created by treasurer Brian Carlson, John Chambers moved, Darrell Cave seconded the motion to accept the treasurer's report. The motion was passed by the membership in attendance.

Old Business:

Gate Damage Repair:

Kevin Anselmi of Watco had a couple of his employees come out and reset the gate posts, replaced the cable and installed a new hook to hold the cable in place. New Business:

Bill Bailey Correspondence:

Jim McKeel recently forwarded an e-mail from longtime Heartland member, Bill Bailey concerning some articles that he has written concerning the KCS. Bill is a very learned fan of the KCS and is well versed in its history.

Membership:

- Discussion was held in regards to membership and ideas on increasing membership. Jim McKeel suggested that for our April meeting, we have a meal as part of a membership appreciation day. Don Richardson suggested that someone perhaps setup a booth at area events advertising what we have to offer.
- Connie Payton moved to have a Membership Appreciation Day, with a meal. Don Richardson seconded the motion. The motion was passed by the membership present.

- John Chambers moved to have the April meeting moved to April 22nd. Don Richardson seconded the motion and it was passed by the members present.

Insurance:

- We have been asked to look into what it would cost to insure the contents of the museum buildings.
- Connie Payton moved and John Chambers seconded a motion to check with our current insurance carrier to start the process of gathering information related to the cost of insuring the contents of the museum buildings. The motion was passed by the membership present.
- Larry will be in contact with our current insurance provider to begin the process.

Board of Directors Meeting:

- Secretary-Treasurer Brian Carlson reported to the group about the special Heart of the Heartlands board meeting that was held prior to the general meeting. Items from that meeting were:
 - Discussion was held about regular hours for the museum. Also discussed was having someone on hand during those hours.
 - It was decided to not hire an employee for the position but rather contract with an individual to provide the service of operating the museum complex during the hours we are open.
 - After the discussion, it was decided to have museum hours, Wednesday through Sunday, from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. The contracted person would provide services from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm from Wednesday through Sunday.
 - The board decided to reach out to John Chambers to see if he would be interested in providing the service.
 - Discussion was also held about the need to recruit and increase membership.
 - Discussion of capital projects and long term needs were also discussed.

Gay Parita Auction:

Although not related to the Heart of the Heartlands, the Gay Parita is a historical significant building that is a neighbor to our museum complex. In its glory days, the Gay Parita was a stop for some of the biggest big bands of the 1940's. Dances were weekly with the crowd attending numbering in the hundreds. The structure was recently acquired and a sale of contents was held in early February. The new owner of the building has plans to renovate the building and restore many of its former characteristics. Larry commented on the sale and John Chambers commented on the planned future of the building.

Joplin Union Depot:

On February 10, 2023, there was a brainstorming meeting held in Joplin to discuss ideas for the future of the depot. Heartland's members John Randall, Tom Johnston and Rob McKnight were on hand to participate. They reported during our meeting that a common theme for the depot centered around a Route 66 theme. Uses for the building included a type of multi-use facility, shops, restaurants, art gallery among others.

Train Ride Requests:

Discussion was held about possible train rides for the upcoming year. The following locations were presented as possibilities.

- Chanute (Artist Alley)
- Pittsburg (Little Balkans Days)
- Bartlesville
- Dewey
- Pittsburg to Carona (possibly a meal)
- Coffeyville
- Winfield

A detailed list will be put together and submitted to the railroad soon.

Safety Meeting:

It was announced that the annual safety meeting will be held after the March meeting. (March 11, after the 1:00 pm meeting). Anyone that wants to help on the rides and has not attended the safety meeting previously, needs to attend this meeting. The online option will be available this year as well.

Jack Evans moved to adjourn the meeting. Darrell Cave seconded the motion and it passed by the membership present.
